ADVANCED ULTRASOUND MACHINE \$70,000

Used for detailed imaging to diagnose a wide variety of conditions affecting the organs and soft tissues of the body, including the heart and blood vessels, liver, gallbladder, spleen, pancreas, kidneys, bladder and thyroid. An essential tool to more effectively assess each patient-s condition.



MOBILE X-RAY UNIT \$ 50,000 Needed to make X-Ray examinations for non-mobile patients in their beds, without the need to transfer them to Radiology.



RESPIRATORS FOR ADULTS \$ 28,000 Used to support patients who are unable to breathe on their own



RESPIRATORS FOR CHILDREN -TWENTY Required \$ 22,500 Used to support children who are unable to breathe on their own.







BLADDER SCAN \$ 22,000 A portable bed side ultrasound used to scan the amount of urine in the bladder for diagnosing urine retention and the need for a urinary catheter. Urinary retention is a common problem amongst the elderly patients.



FULLY EQUIPPED CRASH CART \$ 15,000 With all acute care emergency equipment, including Defibrillator and pulse oximeter. To rush emergency aid in critical care situations.



HEART MONITORS

\$ 12,000 Attached to the critical care patient, this machine keeps moment-tomoment track of all essential heart functions and alerts doctors and nurses to any sudden change in vital heart functioning, especially during weaning from respirators.



COUGH ASSIST MACHINE \$9,000 A crucial ventilator assist therapy for patients in the Chronic Respiratory Care Department.



CO2 LEVEL METER (Capnograph) \$ 3,750 Device to measure Carbon Dioxide level of patients on respirators, so as to make sure that the ventilation is effective.







DEFIBRILLATORS \$10,000 Electric-shock, life-saving apparatus for victims of heart attacks. Used for patients in intensive care.



STANDARD ELECTRO-CARDIOGRAPHS (ECG) \$ 6,000 A regular ..workhorse.. for day-to-day use in heart examination.



MOBILE VITAL SIGNS MONITOR SIX required \$ 3,500 Measures blood pressure (non-invasive), oxygen saturation, pulse rate and body temperature. Used for very ill patients who are not in intensive care



PULSE OXIMETERS TWENTY required \$1,800 Important diagnostic device for patients with breathing and circulatory problems. It measures the amount of oxygen in the blood.



MONITOR FOR GENERAL PARAMETER

\$ 2,500 Measures the cardiac rhythm and amount of oxygen and temperature in the blood continuously.



FOOD PUMPS (...Kangaroo..) \$ 1,000 To control flow of nutrients through infusion



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






\$ 3,750 To weight patients in their beds. This is most important as many patients cannot get out of bed
